INFORMATION FOR WROCLAW EXCHANGE STUDENTS IN KNOXVILLE

Introduction

This exchange represents more than 15 years that printmaking students from The Eugeniusz Geppert Academy of Art and Design in Wrocław, Poland and the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, USA have spent a month as guest artists at the other university. Each May two students from UT Knoxville spend time in Wrocław and each September two students from Wrocław spend the month of September in Knoxville. Students have studio access and present an exhibition of their work during their residencies.

Preparations

For students selected for the exchange, we can arrange to have a Zoom session to help with planning for your residency.

Housing Information

We will provide housing for the guest students from 1 September – 30 September. Specific arrangements change annually, but the accommodations will be on or near campus.

Travel Information

Please inform us of your travel arrangements by sending us a copy of your flight itinerary. We strongly encourage you to make Knoxville, Tennessee (Airport Code: TYS) as your flight destination because, unless you have a personal automobile, travel between cities in the US is often difficult.

What to Expect During Your Visit

During your visit we encourage you to make prints in our well-equipped studio, to participate in classes as you wish, and to be part of our community and our program. We encourage you to attend classes and to be active in making art in our studios. You will present an exhibition of your work at [Gallery 1010](#), our student gallery in downtown Knoxville, or another public exhibition venue. The exhibition will be typically the third week in September, with your reception on Friday. Each student will have about 6 meters of wall space in which to exhibit. In most cases students bring work with them, but also exhibit prints they have completed while in Tennessee. If you need to ship work in advance, make sure it arrived at the UT School of Art well in advance. Students are expected to email Professor Lyons representative images on their work, and artists statement and other information to promote your residency and exhibition on the School of Art website. We will arrange for you to have a temporary student ID as well as access to the student recreation center which has a swimming pool and gym.

Health Insurance

You are expected to arrange for your own travel medical insurance for the duration of your trip.

Telephone and Internet

Your apartment will have a telephone for local calls, but it cannot be used for international calls. Most students who come to the United States get a small, temporary phone, or SIM card. We can also arrange for any laptop computers to have wireless access. The printshop also has a computer lab you can use. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Beauvais Lyons.

During your visit [Dr. Marek Pienkowski](#), Honorary Consulate for the People of Poland and a local arts patron will arrange for a time for you to have lunch with him. Many other members of the Polish-American community will attend your exhibition.
